

Gender Pay Gap Report for Lincoln College, Oxford

The Gender Pay Gap measures the difference between the mean average hourly pay and the median average hourly pay for men and women employed by the College on 5 April, 2025. The gap is expressed as the percentage by which women's average hourly pay is lower than men's average hourly pay. The gap arises largely because more of the higher paid employees are men, as indicated in the chart below.

Median	10.2%

The College does not make bonus payments and consequently there is no mean or median gender pay gap for bonuses to report.
