Stipendiary Lectureship in Pure Mathematics (Fixed Term)

FURTHER PARTICULARS

Lincoln College invites applications for a 6-hour Stipendiary Lectureship in Pure Mathematics, starting Michaelmas Term 2023, to cover short-term teaching needs in the subject. The post is available from 1st September 2023 until 14 April 2024 and is not renewable. The successful candidate will be expected to teach an average of 6 weighted hours per week. They will have, or will be in the final stages of completing a doctorate in mathematics, and will be likely to have teaching experience, at undergraduate level, in pure mathematics.

About Lincoln College

There are 38 self-governing and independent colleges at Oxford, giving both academic staff and students the benefits of belonging to a small, interdisciplinary community as well as to a large, internationally-renowned institution. The collegiate system fosters a strong sense of community, bringing together leading academics and students across subjects, and from different cultures and countries. Founded in 1427, Lincoln is one of the oldest Oxford Colleges and is housed in fine historic buildings located in the centre of the city, close to the Bodleian Library and other University libraries and Faculty buildings. The College has a strong sense of collegiality with a reputation for integrating its Fellows, graduates, and undergraduate students in a highly successful traditional community.

There are currently fifty-seven fellows in College, of whom thirty are Tutorial Fellows responsible for teaching and the welfare of students. About 90 undergraduate and 120 graduate students, in a wide range of subjects, are admitted to Lincoln each year and about 600 students are in residence at any one time. Lincoln currently admits approximately 8 undergraduates each year for Mathematics and Mathematics and Statistics. A small number of graduate students are admitted each year for graduate degrees in Mathematics.

Duties

The Lecturer will teach the following topics from the 1st and 2nd year undergraduate syllabus in Mathematics and Mathematics and Statistics:

1st year: Analysis I and II; Complex Numbers.

2nd year: Complex Analysis and Metric Spaces; Integration.

The Lecturer will also be responsible for monitoring students' academic progress, for submitting termly reports, and for setting and marking termly College tests. The Lecturer is required to participate fully in the undergraduate admissions process, including attendance at any necessary training, and in the pastoral supervision of undergraduates, together with the College Maths tutor, Professor Dominic Vella. The Lecturer is expected to attend social events with undergraduates (e.g. Freshers' dinners). The Lecturer will work under the direction of the senior Fellow in Mathematics and report to the Senior Tutor.

Remuneration, Right to Work in the UK, and Terms of Employment

The salary offered is in the range £14,381- £16,174 per annum (pro-rated for the duration of the post). Applicants will be required to provide original documentation showing their right to work in the UK. Please note that this post is not sponsorable under the UK's points-based immigration system.

The successful candidate will have the option of becoming, or remaining, a member of the Universities Superannuation Scheme (USS). Other benefits include a small book allowance, currently £243 per annum, and a hospitality credit, currently £276.50 per annum. Common Room Rights are offered, which include 5 meals per week (excluding Domus, Guest, and Dessert nights and Chapter Day dinners), with the right to bring a guest to lunch or dinner at the Lecturer's own expense.

The appointment will be subject to the receipt of a satisfactory pre-employment health assessment questionnaire and provision of proof of right to work in the UK.

Selection Criteria

The successful candidate will be able to demonstrate that they meet the following selection criteria:

- Prior experience of undergraduate-level teaching in mathematics, in topics close to those noted above.
- An understanding of the needs of high-achieving undergraduates, and a commitment to fostering high academic achievement in undergraduates.
- Hold, or be close to the completion of, a doctorate in mathematics.
- Good organisational skills, communication skills, and sensitivity to deal effectively with pastoral duties.

Special Arrangements

Oxford welcomes applications from candidates who have a disability. These documents will be made available in large print, audio or other formats on request. Applicants invited for interview will be asked whether they require any particular arrangements to make the interview more convenient and effective for them.

Equal Opportunities

The policy and practice of Lincoln College require that entry into employment within the College and progression within employment be determined only by personal merit and the application of

criteria that are related to the duties of each particular post and the relevant salary structure. Candidates are asked to request two referees to send confidential references direct to the Human Resources Advisor, to arrive by the same deadline noted above. Referees may send letters of recommendation electronically provided that these are sent from an institutional email address.

It is intended that shortlisted candidates will be interviewed Week starting 19th June 2023.
